The Board of School Trustees of the Centerville-Abington Community Schools met at 7:00 p.m. The following members were present at the Spencer Administration Building: Brad Lambright, Susan Hamilton, Todd Duke, and Andy Wandersee. Renee Westover attended via Zoom. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Motion by Todd Duke, second by Renee Westover to approve the consent items as presented. Those voting in favor were: Susan Hamilton, Todd Duke, Renee Westover, Andy Wandersee, and Brad Lambright. Motion passed 5-0. Documentation follows.

Brad Lambright opened the floor to community comments. No one indicated they wanted to speak at the administration building conference room or on Zoom. The floor was closed to community comments.

Old Business:

There was not any old business to conduct.

New Business:

Dr. McCoy reviewed policy #2266 for Title IX and updated the board on the administrators' progress on training. He advised the board that Brian Bellew will be the Title IX coordinator. Dr. McCoy summarized each of the other policies listed on the agenda. This was the first reading for each of the policies. Tabled for the next meeting.

Dr. McCoy asked the school board to consider a stipend for the nurse due to increased working hours to complete COVID-19 contact tracing. Andy Wandersee discussed the possibility of revisiting this in the future if COVID-19 issues continue. Motion by Andy Wandersee to pay a stipend to the nurse for increased working hours as presented, second by Todd Duke. Those voting in favor were: Susan Hamilton, Todd Duke, Renee Westover, Andy Wandersee, and Brad Lambright. Motion passed 5-0. Documentation follows.

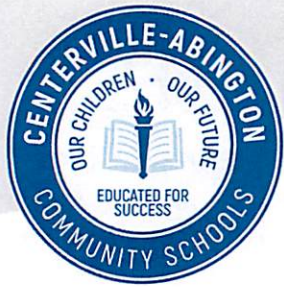
Dr. McCoy asked the school board to consider a stipend for the corporation treasurer for significant additional duties performed during 2020. Motion by Andy Wandersee to pay a stipend to the corporation treasurer for significant additional duties as presented, second by Todd Duke. Those voting in favor were: Susan Hamilton, Todd Duke, Renee Westover, Andy Wandersee, and Brad Lambright. Motion passed 5-0. Documentation follows.

Dr. McCoy asked the school board to consider a hourly rate increase for the bus trainer for the 2020-2021 school year. According to Mark Campbell's research CACS's current hourly rate is much lower than other Indiana schools. Motion by Andy Wandersee to increase the hourly rate for the bus trainer as presented, second by Todd Duke. Those voting in favor were: Susan Hamilton, Todd Duke, Renee Westover, Andy Wandersee, and Brad Lambright. Motion passed 5-0. Documentation follows.

Dr. McCoy asked the school board to consider the 2021-2022 school calendar. As in the past, this calendar goes along with Fayette's for the vocational students attending WTCC. One minor change is from three built in snow days to two built in snow days. Susan Hamilton discussed the possibility of one whole day devoted to professional

development as opposed to a few shortened student days with one to two hours each day devoted to professional development. Dr. McCoy will look into what most teachers prefer. No action taken, tabled for further review.

Dr. McCoy asked the school board to consider the resolution to transfer funds from the Education Fund to the Operations Fund between July 1, 2020 and December 31, 2020. This resolution is required by the DLGF in order to calculate the 2021 budget. Motion by Todd Duke to adopt the resolution for transfers from the Education Fund to the Operations Fund for the period of July 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020 as presented, second by Andy Wandersee. Those voting in favor were: Susan Hamilton, Todd Duke, Renee Westover, Andy Wandersee, and Brad Lambright. Motion passed 5-0. Documentation follows.

Dr. McCoy asked the school board to consider an additional employment report. Motion by Andy Wandersee to approve the additional employment report as presented, second by Todd Duke. Those voting in favor were: Susan Hamilton, Todd Duke, Renee Westover, Andy Wandersee, and Brad Lambright. Motion passed 5-0. Documentation follows.

Report on support services.

- Dr. McCoy advised the school board that it is quite possible the school would have to close if very many of the non-certified employees, in particular the cafeteria workers and bus drivers came down with the coronavirus.

Additional Items:

- Dr. McCoy discussed having an executive session November 4, 2020 after the meeting to vote on the teacher contract. The executive meeting would start at approximately 7:15 pm. Motion by Susan Hamilton to schedule an executive session November 4, 2020 at approximately 7:15 pm after the meeting to vote on the teacher contract at 7:00 pm, second by Andy Wandersee. Those voting in favor were: Susan Hamilton, Todd Duke, Renee Westover, Andy Wandersee, and Brad Lambright. Motion passed 5-0. Documentation follows.
- Todd Duke asked about the number of virtual students. Dr. McCoy reported currently there are 173 virtual students down from 314 as of Monday, October 12, 2020

Motion by Andy Wandersee, second by Todd Duke to adjourn at 8:08 pm. Those voting in favor were: Susan Hamilton, Todd Duke, Renee Westover, Andy Wandersee, and Brad Lambright. Motion passed 5-0.
