The Board of School Trustees of the Centerville-Abington Community Schools met at 7:00 p.m. in the Spencer Administration Building. The following members were physically present: Susan Hamilton, Brad Lambright, Andy Wandersee, and Renee Westover. The following member was not physically present and attended via Zoom: Todd Duke. The public observed the meeting via in-person or through Zoom. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Motion by Susan Hamilton, second by Andy Wandersee to approve the consent items as presented. All members present voted in favor of the motion. Motion passed 5-0. Documentation follows.

Renee Westover thanked Centerstone of Richmond (the Youth as Resources division) for a \$500 donation to Centerville Senior High School to help offset costs associated with Prom and commencement.

Renee Westover opened the floor to community comments.

Dr. McCoy presented the 2022-23 re-entry plan for public hearing and comment. Renee Westover opened the floor to community comments. There were no comments. Renee Westover closed the floor to community comments. Susan Hamilton said she has discussed it with Dr. McCoy that there are some things she is concerned about in the plan. Dr. McCoy said he switched the words “will” to “may” for most of the items just to have something to fall back on if things change. Todd Duke said he looked through the document and did not see anything in it that we are not doing or following. Motion by Andy Wandersee, second by Todd Duke to approve the 2022-23 re-entry plan. Todd Duke, Brad Lambright, Andy Wandersee, and Renee Westover voted in favor of the motion. Susan Hamilton voted against the motion. Motion passed 4-1. Documentation follows.

Dr. McCoy presented the 2022-23 administrative contracts for consideration. There was no discussion. Motion by Andy Wandersee, second by Brad Lambright to approve the 2022-23 administrative contracts. All members present voted in favor of the motion. Motion passed 5-0. Documentation follows.

Mr. Stevenson presented the flooring quotes for removing and installing flooring at Rose Hamilton and Centerville Senior High School for consideration. Mr. Stevenson said this work would be completed in July before school begins. Motion by Andy Wandersee, second by Brad Lambright to approve the flooring quotes for removing and installing flooring at Rose Hamilton and Centerville Senior High School. All members present voted in favor of the motion. Motion passed 5-0. Documentation follows.

Dr. McCoy presented several summer camps for athletic teams to attend for consideration. There are two summer camps. Motion by Susan Hamilton, second by Andy Wandersee to approve the summer camps for two athletic teams. All members present voted in favor of the motion. Motion passed 5-0. Documentation follows.

Dr. McCoy and Mr. Stevenson presented an update on the CAE building project. Mr. Stevenson said Thor Construction has removed the poles in the bus parking lot and finished the west courtyard sidewalks. The installation of the lockers is complete, and they are continuing to place carpet and ceramic tiles. They have also started painting the underside of the office canopy and will be setting the benches soon. Thor is still working on replacing the tire swings that were destroyed at the beginning of the school year. Brad Lambright asked when the board should begin discussions on the future plans of the Annex. It was decided discussion should start at the conclusion of the elementary building project. No action required.

Mr. Stevenson presented an update on support services. He said the two new buses that were ordered in December 2021 are delayed and the build date is now November 22, 2022. Mr. Stevenson said furniture for the new addition has been delivered. The company will come back in July to put the furniture together and deliver the items to classrooms. He said the administration will be opening up the Annex for alumni tours at 2 p.m. on Saturday, June 25, prior to the annual alumni dinner. No action required.
